PCA ROADMAP TO CARBON NEUTRALITY

Michelle L. Wilson, FACI, has over 25 years of experience relating to concrete materials, specifications, performance, troubleshooting and repair. She is responsible for PCA's technical resources, covering the entire spectrum of cement and concrete technology. The PCA Roadmap to carbon neutrality by 2050 involves the entire value chain including clinker, cement, concrete, construction, and the use of concrete as a carbon sink.
