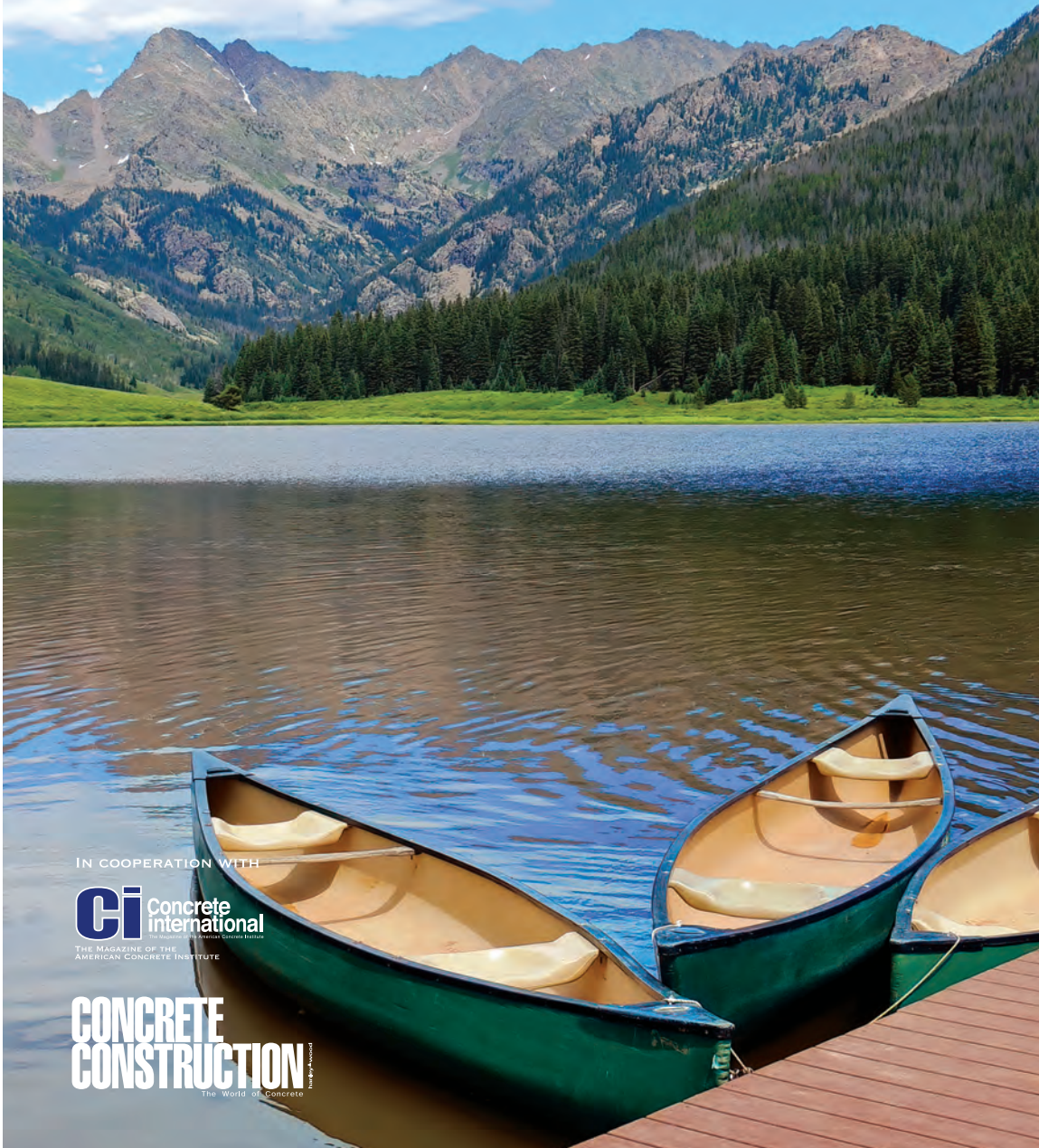

The Local Area



Beaver Creek is a mountain village in the heart of the Colorado Rocky Mountains, delivering a one-of-a-kind experience. At the center of Beaver Creek, explore a charming alpine village and enjoy simple moments together in this extraordinary setting. Beaver Creek Village provides an elegant array of dining, shopping, and entertainment. Beaver Creek Wonder is an artistic playground of photo-friendly, oversized sculptures, scattered throughout the village with art installations that bring to life a sense of adventure and discovery. Each element is designed to draw families in and provide a photo-worthy backdrop to capture and share.

The elevation in Beaver Creek is 8,100 ft. Those not accustomed to the altitude may become more winded than usual while climbing stairs, hiking, or exercising. Alcohol consumption will not impact your body any differently at high altitude than at sea level, but someone whose body has not acclimated is less equipped to effectively process alcohol. We recommend consuming carefully and drinking plenty of water prior to arrival as well as throughout the event.



Transportation

Directions from Eagle County Regional Airport to Park Hyatt Beaver Creek Resort and Spa

- Eagle County Regional Airport is 28.1 miles west of Beaver Creek.
- Epic Mountain Express and Park 1 Express offer shuttle service to the hotel.

01. From the airport, head east on Cooley Mesa Rd toward Eldon Wilson Rd.
02. Turn right onto US-6 East.
03. At the traffic circle, take the second exit onto Grand Ave.
04. At the second traffic circle, take the third exit onto Eby Creek Rd.
05. At the third traffic circle, take the second exit and stay on Eby Creek Rd.
06. At the fourth traffic circle, take the first exit onto the I-70 E ramp.
07. From I-70 E, take exit 167 onto Avon Rd.
08. Take Village Rd. to E. Thomas Pl. in Beaver Creek.
09. Merge onto Avon Rd.
10. At the fifth traffic circle, take the second exit and stay on Avon Rd.
11. At the sixth traffic circle, take the second exit. Stay on Avon Rd.
12. At the seventh traffic circle, take the second exit onto Village Rd.
13. Turn left onto Offerson Rd.
14. Turn right onto E. Thomas Pl.

Axe Throwing *

Horseback Riding *

Experience one of the most untouched natural environments in Colorado. Take in the view of stunning Beaver Creek, spot wildlife, enjoy majestic mountain views, and identify wildflowers, all from the back of a well-trained horse. Long pants, enclosed shoes, and a hat are recommended. Riders must be 7 years or older.



Betty Ford Alpine Gardens Tour *

Located at 8,200 feet, Betty Ford Alpine Gardens is one of the world's highest botanical gardens. The gardens showcase an assortment of unique high elevation plants and feature rotating exhibits in the Education Center and outdoor displays. This private tour winds through the beautiful gardens and ends at the adorable Schoolhouse Gift Shop in the Children's Garden. You'll learn about alpine flora and mountain environments and the history of the Betty Ford Alpine Gardens and Vail.

Golf *

Beaver Creek Golf Club, nestled against the slopes of Beaver Creek Mountain, is one of the longest established golf courses in Vail Valley. The course was designed by noted course architect Robert Trent Jones, Jr., and is known and respected for its long, narrow, challenging fairways and its stunning scenery. They say the higher elevation allows for a smoother carry and it doesn't hurt that you may see an eagle while trying to score one.



White Water Rafting * White Water Class 2 Upper Colorado River

The scenic Colorado River is a great option for families with young children and a bona fide introduction to rafting. The 'Upper C' is home to magnificent red rim rock canyons, great stands of pinyon and juniper trees, and expansive sage arroyos teeming with wildlife. Sightings of deer, elk, muskrat, great blue heron, eagles, osprey, and hawks are not uncommon amid the incredible scenery. Guides, gear, and snacks included. Thrill seekers 4 years or older are welcome to participate in this adventure.
